Principal's Message



ApplyAlberta is an online application and transcript transfer system that everyone can use when applying to Alberta's public post-secondary institutions.

Go to: www. applyalberta.ca

Create: a MyAlberta Digital ID

Choose: your post-secondary institution from the list.

Fill out: the specific information required by the post-secondary institution.

Submit: your application and pay the application fees using a credit card.

Use: your profile every time you want apply to a public post-secondary institution in Alberta. Also authorize the transfer of your Alberta high school transcripts at no cost.
