Principal's Message


Dear Parents/ Guardians and Students,

QUESTIONS ANSWERED: When does the mass officially start?

- * There isn't a single moment when the mass begins. *
- 1. It begins actually at our homes- when we leave our private homes/places to gather in one communal place; we begin to prepare ourselves for this sacred mystery. Greeting people, smiling, laughing in the entrance or vestibule are a part of preparing ourselves.
- 2. Blessing ourselves reminds us of our baptism, reminds us of our duties as Christians, reminding us that we are entering a sacred space, that we believe, and that we acknowledge that Christ is present in sacramental form (Tabernacle)
- 3. Entrance Chant/Song- silence at this time is not recommended. When celebrant reaches the altar, he places the gospel on it, he kisses it- drawing audience attention to the holiness of the space.
- 4. Priest greets the audience, "The Lord Be with you," to which the congregation responds, "And with your spirit"; a means of acknowledging the importance of congregation, and calling all to be involved in the mass. This starts our worship, and then we go into the mystery of faith.
- 5. The "Gloria" should not be skipped- should be joyful and sung- goes back to the beginning of time when our church first began to celebrate being present with the Lord, and excited that Christ is in our midst.

Grade 7/8F students are preparing for the DELF exam for the spring session.


