Ms. Manon and the high school leadership class are currently brainstorming new fundraising ideas for Grapesyard! Stay tuned!!



He was famous for teaching children to "Look for the helpers" in scary times. Knowing his background, I have no doubt that he was pointing these children to look for people who were showing the presence of God through their merciful acts to help others in need. As William Barry observed, Mister Rogers knew that, "People can be the images of God because of the presence of the Spirit of God moving all of us in that direction." Catholic Education
