Who's eligible for scholarships?

You are!

But where to start ??

- 1) Start by looking through this handbook for scholarships to apply for. There are many local, apprenticeship, post-secondary, provincial and national scholarships.
- 2) Check with your parents to see if their employers, or organizations they belong to, offer any scholarships or bursaries.
- 3) The information in this booklet is not a complete guide of what scholarships, grants and bursaries are available. Check out the websites listed on the following page.
- 4) There is **A LOT** of money out there for students, and by no means does this handbook contain all of the scholarships, bursaries, or awards available. It takes **HARD WORK** and **TIME** to hunt down other scholarships, awards and bursaries. Don't feel that because your marks are not high enough you will not qualify—there are awards available for students entering particular fields of study, athletic, leadership, community service or bursaries based on financial need, etc.
- 5) At the time this booklet was created, to the best of our knowledge, all the information is correct. However always check the websites for the most up to date information.

So what is the difference between Scholarships, Bursaries, Grants and Loans?

Scholarships - money that does not have to be repaid and is often based on some sort of excellence. Some scholarships are one-time cheques while others are money provided for each semester or year. They can also differ in that some are paid directly to the student and some are pay directly to the institution the student will attend.

Bursaries - money you do not have to pay back and is usually based on financial need or academic achievement.

Grants - money that you do not have to pay back and is often given for a specific purpose or based on financial need or special circumstances.

Student Loans - money that must be repaid, with interest (the rate charged for borrowing the money) within a defined period of time. Student loans are usually interest free while you are in school. After your Period of Study End Date, you are usually given a 6 month grace period before you have to start payments.

Timeline for Scholarships

OCTOBER – NOVEMBER

This is the “kick-off” of scholarship season for the following school year.

DECEMBER — APRIL

These months are really the “high season” of scholarships. There are millions of dollars up for grabs throughout these months. Deadlines seem to be evenly spread through out these months. Just know, this is prime scholarship time and you should certainly be working on them during these months.

MAY — AUGUST

These months are the “final stretch” months where everyone is rushing to find final dollars for the fall.

Tips for Applying for Scholarships

1. Get Motivated and Do Your Research

The first step to finding money to help pay for your post-secondary education is the will and motivation to take the time to search and apply for awards. This needs to come from within YOU. You have to be willing to put in the effort and the hours if you want to win money for school. Start as early as possible—even in Grade 11—on researching what's out there and when you need to apply so you're organized. An hour of working at Tim Horton's earns you \$13.00, but an hour of applying for scholarships could earn you \$5,000.

2. Look Around

High School guidance counsellors and university financial aid offices are obvious places to find scholarships, but they're not the only places. Other sources are local businesses such as credit unions and a parent's place of work or professional organizations they're members of. A good old-fashion internet search is another too, but be careful that if somebody is asking you to pay to apply it's probably not something you want to do.

3. Budget Your Time Effectively

The truth is, finding the best scholarships is time consuming and writing an essay and gathering reference letters stops a lot of students from applying. Don't be one of those students. Set some time aside to look and apply.

4. Understand the Requirements

Read the eligibility requirements through very carefully. If you are not sure what one of the requirements means, or if it applies to you, ask. It only takes a few minutes to ask questions, versus the time to write an essay for an award you can't win.

5. Highlight Your Strengths

While academic marks are one of the primary criteria, awards committees are looking for well-round students too. It's not just about checking all the boxes. Don't discount things you do that might seem mundane but actually show responsibility and maturity. Things like helping your elderly grandparents, or getting your siblings ready to go to school on a regular basis because your parent is working or you are responsible for getting up every morning to milk the cows.

6. Pay Attention to Detail

Just as important as picking the scholarships you are eligible for is making sure you supply everything required to be considered. Dot all the i's, cross all the t's, and in any essay questions, be sure to be very clear that you understand what they are looking for. Check spelling and grammar before submitting, and don't wait until the last minute to submit.

7. Don't Forget About the Smaller Awards

Applying for a \$10,000 scholarship sounds better than applying for a \$2,000 one, but remember the higher the value the more students who will probably apply for it. This is where it becomes important to go for the smaller awards. Five \$2,000 scholarships equals one \$10,000.

ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENCE & TECHNOLOGY SCHOLARSHIP

Value: \$1000.00

Number: One

Criteria:

- Must demonstrate an interest and concern for protecting the environment from adverse affects caused by our daily living necessities, with emphasis on waste and/or waste water.
- Must be a graduate of St. Michael's School
- Date of scholarship application must not be longer than 2 years following date of graduation.
- Confirmation of enrolment/registration in the post secondary course of study.
- Demonstrate leadership and/or contributions to the community.

Application Process:

1. Complete all sections of application
2. Include a letter of recommendation from your High School or the post secondary institution, if you are already enrolled.
3. Include a statement of personal community related activities.
4. Include a statement of why you are pursuing a career in Environmental Science and Technology.

No other information will be presented to the Awards Committee for review. Materials will not be returned. Please retain a copy of your application and supporting documents for your records. All applicants must inform themselves as to the tax consequences of receiving the Scholarship.

APPRENTICESHIP SCHOLARSHIPS



RAP (Registered Apprenticeship Program) Scholarship

Value: \$1000.00

Number: Five Hundred

Criteria: Be a Canadian Citizen and a resident of Alberta who has completed the requirements for a high school diploma by June of their graduating year.

Be registered as an apprentice in the Registered Apprenticeship Program OR have successfully completed a Career and Technology Studies apprenticeship pathway through an Alberta high school.

Not be a previous RAP/CTS Scholarship recipient.

Apply: This scholarship program is one that you don't even have to apply for to be eligible! When you register as an apprentice in your My Tradesecrets account you just need to consent and provide your Social Insurance Number. Apprentices must keep their MyTradesecrets profile up-to-date, including their mailing address.

Disbursement: Cheques will be mailed to the address in the recipient's MyTradesecrets profile by November 1.

Arthur Paulin Automotive Aftermarket Scholarship

Value: \$1,000

Number: Five (or more)

Criteria: Applicants must be enrolled in an automotive aftermarket industry related program or curriculum at a Canadian college or university. This includes students pursuing their studies as an automotive apprentice. It also includes studies in any of the following automotive sectors: auto body, hard parts, heavy duty, or motive power (machinists).

Value: \$1,000


Number: Varies

Criteria: For students who are enrolled in a qualifying trades program at a registered education institute. This includes, but is not limited to, mechanical, electrical, instrumentation, welding, pipe fitting and camp related positions.

Post-Secondary Scholarships



Lethbridge College Awards and Scholarships

- Value: Over 1 million dollars given to Lethbridge College Students
- Number: Varies
- Criteria: With just one online application, you can apply for all of the awards and scholarships that you qualify for at Lethbridge College. A few minutes of your time can help fund your future.

- Deadline: Opens March 1 and closes July 1 for entrance students

University of Lethbridge Grade 11 Merit Award

- Value: \$500 (75-79.9%)
\$800 (80% and higher)
- Number: Approximately 150
- Criteria: The Grade 11 Merit Award is given to students who fill out the online form by June 30th in their Grade 11 year. It is a simple process — no essay or letters of recommendation necessary. This award is calculated using your Grade 11 average.

University of Lethbridge Board of Governor's Admission Scholarships

- Value: \$1000 (Grade 12 average of 80% or higher)
- Number: Varies
- Criteria: For students entering the University of Lethbridge in the fall semester. This scholarship rewards students who apply early to uLethbridge. May be combined with other uLethbridge awards, e.g., High School Entrance Awards and the Grade 11 Merit Award. Apply to U of L by December 15 and you'll be automatically considered.

University of Lethbridge High School Entrance Awards

- Value: Up to \$6,000
- Number: Variable
- Criteria: You must first apply for admission to the University of Lethbridge and either be going directly from high school, or without having attended another post-secondary institution. High School awards are available based on your admission average as well as other criteria, such as leadership ability, volunteer experience, financial need, or artistic ability. A separate scholarship application is required for these awards.
- Apply: Log in to [the Bridge](#) and fill out the General and the Undergraduate scholarship applications online.
Enter your uLethbridge student ID number and Password
Click on 'Student'
Click on 'Apply for uLethbridge Scholarships, Awards and Bursaries' and sign in
Complete the 'General Application', the 'Undergraduate Scholarship and Awards Application' and any other award opportunities that may appear
Click 'Finish and Submit' to complete each application before the deadline

University of Calgary Entrance Awards

Value: Variable

Number: Variable

Criteria: You must first apply for admission. You will be given access to the award application once you have submitted your application for admission. You can access the award application through [My UCalgary](#). You will need your [eID and password](#) which you created when you applied for admission.

University of Calgary Pathways To Medicine Scholarship

Value: \$27,000 (over 4 years)

Number: Five

Criteria: This award is for students from low socioeconomic status backgrounds. Consideration will be given to students who have indigenous ancestry and/or from a rural community. Applicants must apply to their undergraduate degree program of choice at the University of Calgary independently. This scholarship applies only to studies at the University of Calgary.

University of Alberta Academic Excellence Scholarships

- Value: U of A awards \$28 million each year in undergraduate scholarships & awards
- Number: Variable
- Criteria: You must apply to an undergraduate degree program before you can apply for any entrance scholarships. You must be entering university directly from high school in September of the upcoming year in an undergraduate degree program with fewer than 12 credits of university course work taken during high school. Your eligibility will be based on your high school admission average at the time of your admission offer. The U of A will assess you for a match.

University of Alberta Bursaries

- Value: Up to \$8,000
- Number: Variable
- Criteria: To be eligible for a bursary, you must be able to demonstrate financial need for the current academic year after exhausting all available funding resources and meeting the academic and enrollment requirements.

- Value: \$800
- Number: Three
- Criteria: Must be a Male student enrolling in his first year of full-time undergraduate studies at the University of Alberta. The applicant must display all of the following individual attributes and maintain a healthy and productive balance between: Friendship, Knowledge, Service, Morality and Excellence.

Alexander Rutherford Scholarship

Values:

Grade 10: Average 75% to 79.9% - \$300 Average 80% or Higher- \$400

Grade 11: Average 75% to 79.9% - \$500 Average 80% or Higher- \$800

Grade 12: Average 75% to 79.9% - \$700 Average 80% or Higher- \$1,300

Average is calculated from 5 designated courses : Averages are not rounded up for Scholarship purposes.

Grade 10: One of: English 10-1, 10-2 or Français 10-1 or 10-2

At least two of: Mathematics 10C, Science 10, Social Studies 10-1 or 10-2, or a language other than one used above at the Grade 10 level.

Any two courses with minimum three credit value at Grade 10 level (1000 or 4000 series) including those listed above and combined introductory CTS courses.

Grade 11: One of: English 20-1, 20-2 or Français 20-1 or 20-2

At least two of: Mathematics 20-1, or 20-2, Chemistry 20, Physics 20, Science 20, Biology 20, Social Studies 20-1 or 20-2 or a language other than one used above at the Grade 11 level.

Any two courses: with minimum three credit value at Grade 11 level (2000 or 5000 series) including those listed above and combined intermediate CTS courses.

Grade 12: One of: English 30-1, 30-2 or Français 30-1 or 30-2

At least two of: Mathematics 30-1, 30-2 or 31, Science 30, Social Studies 30-1 or 30-2, Biology 30, Chemistry 30, Physics 30 or a language other than one used above at the Grade 12 level.

Any two courses with minimum five credit value at Grade 12 level (3000 or 6000 series) including those listed above and combined advanced CTS courses .

Criteria: Have completed high school on or after September 30, 1980. Applicants must be a Canadian Citizen or a permanent resident of Canada and an Alberta resident. Be enrolled in a full course load in a designated post-secondary or an apprenticeship program of at least one semester in length.

Apply: Apply online. The Alberta Government Scholarship Program is managed through Student Aid Alberta. After receiving acceptance to attend a Post-Secondary Institution, students should apply Online at the Student Aid Alberta website www.studentaid.alberta.ca for the Alexander Rutherford Scholarships You must create a personal account and verify your identity with Alberta Student Aid. Deadline: There will no application time deadlines. Students must identify the post-secondary school they have been accepted into or planning to attend as their preferred post-secondary institution, or they can apply at any time during their post-secondary study period.

4 –H Scholarships and Awards

Value: Up to \$2,500

Number: Varies

Criteria: By completing one online application, 4-H members will be considered for all of the 4-H Alberta Scholarships for which they are eligible. Applicants can only receive one (1) 4-H Alberta Scholarship (up to \$2,500), but may also receive a region or district scholarship in the same application year. You must be a past or present member of a 4-H Alberta Club. You may apply for a 4-H scholarship every year that you are a full time post-secondary student at an officially recognized institution. Successful applicants must provide proof that they are attending a post secondary institution as a full time student.

Number: One

Criteria: Be an Albertan who is advancing their education in the area of recreation for people with disabilities. Selection for the award is based on: academic record, related course work, memberships, awards, work /volunteer experience in the field of recreation for person persons with disabilities and future plans.

Alberta Equity Scholarship

Value: \$2000

Number: Two

Criteria: Students must be a resident of Alberta, Saskatchewan, or Manitoba and be accepted into a full-time recognized broadcast education program at a post-secondary educational institution in Alberta, Saskatchewan or Manitoba. Preference will be given to members of groups currently underrepresented in the broadcast industry: persons with disabilities, aboriginal peoples, women and members of visible minorities. The submission requires a short essay. Check the website for more information on the essay topic.

Alberta Fish And Game Association Scholarship

Value: \$1,500

Number: One

Criteria: The applicant must be enrolled in a minimum one-year environmental sciences or related program at an accredited Alberta post-secondary Institution. The applicant or their parent must be a member of the Alberta Fish and Game Association or an affiliated fish and game club. The scholarship will not necessarily go to the student with the highest grades. Consideration will be given to past experience and/or involvement with the Alberta Fish and Game Association or other related-interest organizations (i.e. Junior Forest Wardens Scouts, etc.).

Alberta Junior Athletic Award

Value: \$1,000 up to \$2,000

Number: Alberta Junior Football teams - Thirty awards
Friends of Alberta Junior Hockey Society - Ten awards
Prairie Baseball Academy - Thirty awards

Criteria: Applicants must be a Canadian Citizen, or a permanent resident of Canada, and an Alberta resident. Be enrolled in at least 60% of a full course load for the term, have a minimum GPA of 2.0 on a 4.0 scale, be a participant in one of the following junior sports teams:- Alberta junior hockey team- Alberta junior football team- Prairie Baseball Academy.
The Alberta Junior Athletic Award recognizes and rewards junior athletes and provides an incentive for athletes to continue with their post-secondary education. Submit your application to your team coach. You must include, a current official transcript, and an essay outlining your extracurricular activities and future goals.

Alberta Milk - Alberta Schools Athletic Association Scholarship

Value: \$1,000

Number: Two- One Male and One Female

Criteria: Be a Grade 12 student, an Alberta resident, who participates in athletic activities and is planning to attend a post-secondary institution in Canada. The award is for students who achieve a balance in school, home and community life.
ASAA member schools may submit a nomination for one male and one female only. The application form must be signed by the school principal/assistant principal. Priority will be given to student athletes who have participated in ASAA sanctioned sports.

Value: \$1,500

Number: One

Criteria: Pursuing full-time study in a Faculty of Education. Be an Alberta resident from a family where neither parent has received a university degree. Awarded to the student with the highest academic average in three designated grade 12 subjects

Al Larson Memorial Scholarship

Value: \$2,500

Number: Two -One for a student accepted into a university program,
- One for a student accepted into a college or technical school

Criteria: These scholarships are awarded annually to children or grandchildren of a member of the Alberta Real Estate Association who is entering their first year of study. Scholarships are awarded based on a combination of a student's performance in academics and extra-curricular activities -- such as fine arts, athletics, charitable works, and volunteerism -- during their high school years.

Number: Five (one for each of the 5 AAAF regions)

Criteria: This bursary is intended for students continuing their education at a college or university. Student must be enrolled in an agricultural or environmental science program and be a resident of Alberta and accepted at a post-secondary institution in Alberta.

Number: One

Criteria: Applicants must be a Canadian Citizen and Alberta resident, have completed Grade 12 in Alberta and must be continuing their studies at a degree granting post-secondary school in Canada. Grade 12 high school students are ranked according to the same criteria as for the Rutherford Scholars.

Criteria: The Florence E. Taylor Charitable Foundation Scholarship is made available to women through the generous contribution of Florence E. Taylor, a member of Chapter C, Alberta, P.E.O. (Philanthropic Educational Organization) Sisterhood. Applicants must be a resident of Alberta or Saskatchewan and be entering your first or second year of full time study in your first degree or diploma program. Be studying at a post-secondary institution in Alberta or Saskatchewan, demonstrate financial need, and be sponsored by a P.E.O. Chapter.

UWC is a two-year pre-university school (Grade 12 and Gap Year) for up to 200 students representing about 90 countries, who live, study and grow together in the beautiful Pacific Northwest rainforest on the southwest tip of Vancouver Island in the Province of British Columbia

Value: Tuition, room, board and one return trip home per year. Each scholarship covers both years of the program.

Number: Eight

Criteria: Applicants must be Alberta residents between the ages of 16 and 17 and-a-half. Applicants are in the process of completing Grade 11. Recipients are evaluated by a selection committee. Scholarships are awarded based on students' academic record, breadth of study, personal accomplishments, community involvement and interests in UWC goals.


