Always so much to do at this time of year, and it can lead us to lose sight of the true delight we celebrate at Christmas. A few years ago Archbishop Martin W. Currie gave the following message that reminds us of God's love this Christmas and our call to respond to that love. Christmas is, first and foremost, about Love, God's Love. How much does God love us? God loves us so much that God gave us the most precious gift imaginable, Jesus, God's own Son. That's the heart of Christmas.



This great and wonderful love calls us to love one another. We share love in and through our human relationships. Love isn't always a warm and

cozy feeling; love is a commitment and a decision to stick by others, come what may, through thick and thin, when the going is easy and when the going gets more challenging. The love that we share in our human relationships is a reflection of the love of God, calling us to give of ourselves for others. At Christmas, we remember that Jesus was born in poverty, in a stable among the poorest people and the farm animals. What does this mean for us today? Winter has finally arrived!! Please send your child to school with appropriate winter gear as we still go outside for recess!





Last week, we received this message from the company that for so many years has trucked our orders for California oranges and grapefruit up to southern Alberta to the delight of our school community at St. Michael's, as well as many other area schools:

I'm very sad to tell you that we have made the difficult decision to end bringing the fruit up from California. There were multiple hurdles we were facing, but the biggest one is that our supplier there [in California] is in his mid-eighties and has been experiencing some health issues. It's disappointing for us as well as for all those who enjoyed the fruit. We hope you can get another fundraiser in its place. It has been great dealing with all of you over the years and especially Kevin Parkin who worked very hard at getting it all started in Pincher Creek. Thank you and if we ever had another opportunity to get it going again we would certainly contact you.'

We sincerely thank all of you who have supported our Citrus Fundraiser for so many years, and we share your sadness that we will not taste the beautiful oranges and grapefruits this February. Friends of St. Michael's will be working during 2023 to see if we can find another California supplier for the fruit for 2024.
