School updates: Enrolment is up 31 students plus 2 Japanese International Students!

I. <u>Elementary:</u> As described by Alberta Education: 'Alberta's new K to 6 curriculum is founded on 4 key learning themes: literacy, numeracy, citizenship and practical skills. These themes are applied in all grades across all subject areas. This new focus ensures classrooms are centers of learning excellence. In September 2023, Kindergarten to Grade 6 students will learn new provincial curriculum in the following subjects and grades: Science (K—3) English Language Arts and

Literature (Grade 4-6) Mathematics (Grade 4-6).'-alberta.ca

What's new

In September 2023, school authorities began implementing 3 new K to 3 curriculums with teachers and students in classrooms. These 3 subjects include:

- French first language and literature
- French immersion language arts and literature
- Science

In the 2023-24 school year, all K to 6 students will also be learning the new English language arts and literature and mathematics curriculums.

School authorities will have the option to implement a new curriculum for grades 4 to 6 French First language and literature, French immersion language arts and literature and science or wait until the 2024-25 school year.

We will continue to take a balanced and measured approach to piloting and implementing the remaining draft K to 6 subjects. As a result, we've purchased a plethora of new resources such as UFLI, MathUp, etc. that teachers are implementing and receiving more orientation on in our Oct 6th PD day.

II. <u>Junior High/ Senior High</u>: This year we've implemented new protocols for course selection, and option courses. Students were sent home a form for parents/students to sign up and sign off on all classes for the entire school year. The success rate of return was positive! All course

fees are listed in our 'fees' section on our website...

-Field trips are also being planned for the entire year now. This way, proper protocols for fundraising, and implementation will be much more organized, streamlined and effective in the end.
