
ARISE - God is in our Hearts!

We are coming to the end of another school year! This year our faith plan focus was ARISE! Over the course of the year we were challenged to look inward and see how God is in our hearts. This year we looked at Scriptures from Isaiah and Jeremiah, reminding us to arise and shine for the glory of the Lord is upon us and to remember that God has a plan for us, a plan that gives us a future full of hope. Next year our theme is BUILD! We will be looking outward, reflecting on how God is in our minds, giving us the ability to see the needs of our community and world and to respond in action to bring good! Much more to come on that next year!

Over the summer as we move into a time where we can relax and reflect, let us continue to look inward, and to see how God is moving in our hearts and is calling us to love. To guide this reflection, perhaps the following words that Pope Francis spoke at St. Peter's Square on June 12, 2022 may help:

"Let us think about the good, generous, gentle people we have met; recalling their way of thinking and acting, we can have a small reflection of God-Love. And what does it mean to love? Not only to wish them well and to be good to them, but first and foremost, at the root, to welcome, to be open to others, to make room for others, to give space to others. This is what it means to love, at the root.

To understand this better, let us think of the names of the divine Persons, which we pronounce every time we make the sign of the cross: each name contains the presence of the other. The Father, for example, would not be such without the Son; likewise, the Son cannot be considered alone, but always as the Son of the Father. And the Holy Spirit, in turn, is the Spirit of the Father and the Son. In short, the Trinity teaches us that one can never be without the other. We are not islands; we are in the world to live in God's image: open, in need of others and in need of helping others. And so, let us ask ourselves this last question: in everyday life, am I too a reflection of the Trinity? The sign of the cross I make every day — the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit — is that sign of the cross we make every day a gesture for its own sake, or does it inspire my way of speaking, of encountering, of responding, of judging, of forgiving?"

They are able to provide community resources, and help bring awareness to mental health and wellness.



What can families enrolling their child in Trinity High School expect?

Trinity teachers support students individually as they learn through distributed learning modules.

Trinity offers students a small, caring, understanding and welcoming school environment where students are accepted, encouraged and treated with dignity.

Less formal and structured than a traditional school. Individual learning plans are developed with student, caregivers and school.

Who would be the ideal learner to attend the Trinity 10-12 alternative program?

Students who enjoy and excel learning independently.

Students who due to work or sports commitments need the flexibility in their timetable. Students who have difficulty attending school due to mental health conditions, such as anxiety or depression.

Students who have had gaps in attendance through the pandemic and have had a hard time re-engaging in school.

Students who have had difficulty socially engaging with peers, or who feel overwhelmed by large numbers of students in traditional classrooms and schools.

What are the expectations/requirements for students attending Trinity?

READY ~Students need to want to be engaged in learning. It is OK if you have gaps in your education. We will meet you where you are at.

WILLING ~Students need to be committed to attending or meeting with their teachers regularly.

ABLE~ Students must have the reading skills, learning habits and maturity to be successful in self-paced learning.

2023/2024 REGISTRATION

Re-Registration Starts January 16, 2023

Families with students currently enrolled in our system should expect an email during the week of January 16-20, 2023 asking that the online "Registration Update Form" be completed for each child attending one of our schools in the 2023/2024 school year.

This update allows us to make sure the information on file is accurate and that any legal declarations, preferences, and consents are renewed. It also allows our schools to plan for the upcoming school year.

Parents/guardians who are hoping to register younger siblings new to the division will also have the opportunity to do this at the same time that they re-register older students.

New Student Registration Starts February 1, 2023

All Early Learning to Grade 12 students who are new to the division and wish to enroll for the 2023/2024 school year are invited to register online starting on Wednesday, February 1, 2023.

- Our Early Learning Program is designed to stimulate the growing curiosity of children 3 and 4 years of age.
- Kindergarten is designed for children 5 years of age on, or before, December 31, 2023.
- Grade 1 registrants must be 6 years of age on, or before, December 31, 2023.
- French Immersion is also available. Enrollment starts:
 - in Kindergarten/Grade 1 at École St. Mary School in Lethbridge.
 - in Grade 1 at St. Michael's School in Pincher Creek.
